\* WSR hosts *Faithful to the Beautiful Feast of Life: A New Reading of Betrayal and Scandal in Women's Resistance to Redemptive Violence*. A Talk By Rev. Rebecca Parker. Thursday, April 17<sup>th</sup> at 10:30am in the Dinner Boardroom. Twenty-five years ago, feminist and womanist theologians began questioning the Christian doctrine of atonement. Betrayal of the ethics of the feast table and scandal at the humiliation of crucifixion, form the background this talk. The Rev. Dr. Rebecca Parker has been President of Starr King School for the Ministry since 1990 and Professor of Theology since 2000. She is the first woman to serve as the permanent head of an accredited theological school. (2 Units)
